BEYOND EXTINCTION: (RE-THINKING) IGBO LANGUAGE STUDIES, LITERATURE, HERITAGE, ARTS AND CULTURE

To me, it's a sign of a deeply disturbed scenario where a language in its endangered state are acceptable, and not too many of the indigenous speakers embrace the language. Before the onslaught of the European colonization, many African communities including the Igbos were knitted into and hidden within the myriad cultural heritage enjoying and relying on their synergistic relationship with their cultural heritage, developing profound intuitive knowledge about their language, culture, arts, literature, religion, and norms. These practices, were largely disrupted within the interstices informed by European colonization and other marginalized populations. Thus, the knitted into and hidden within the myriad of the Western culture by the indigenous speakers, leave many rich Igbo cultural heritage, language, arts and culture endangered - on fire or moving into extinct!

The questions now are, by what politics of cuteness, function, or cadence have researchers and linguists held out against the endangerment of Igbo language, arts, culture, literature and diversity? How might the units we assume in foreign cultures denied us other intricate links between our heritage, culture, languages and development? How might scholars, and with what implications for the imperative endeavour to encourage the development of Igbo language technology, and preserve the Igbo language and culture under the present signs of extinction? What optics as linguists awaits us at sites of the Igbo language extinction, to ensure that Igbo language is preserved, documented, digitalized, developed, reimaged and reinvented?

Can researchers and scholars find innovative pathways to discovery while remaining hopeful that the Igbo language, arts and culture will not be beyond revival?

References are to be rendered in APA style (7th edition).
